Post-M.S.N. Nurse Practitioner Graduate Certificate

This post-graduate certificate is designed for nurses holding M.S.N. degrees who wish to become nurse practitioners (NPs), or practicing NPs who seek other concentrations within their fields. Each candidate must make an application to the program as a certificate candidate and must meet the admission requirements for the M.S.N. program.
