Understand our tuition philosophy.

WilmU® does not differentiate between in-state and out-of-state students. So whether you choose to take courses in person at our locations throughout Delaware or New Jersey, or decide to take them online, **tuition will always be a low rate.** Tuition is charged on a per-credit basis, so you only need to pay for the credits you're actually taking.

Get ready for school by educating your wallet:

FINANCIAL AID 101

Any kind of funding that helps pay for college is considered financial aid. It can come from the federal government, private sources or the University itself. It includes:

Federal Student Aid

Federal Student Aid is the most common form of financing for students and can include grants, loans and work study. In order to be considered for federal aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

The federal government determines your overall eligibility for federal aid when you complete the FAFSA, and it's the first step in WilmU's financial aid process. Complete and submit your FAFSA at studentaid.gov using **Wilmington University's School Code: 007948**. Keep in mind that Wilmington University's financial aid year begins in the fall semester and ends with summer.

Payment Plans

You may choose to pay your tuition costs in monthly installments throughout the semester for any tuition and fees not covered by any financial aid award you may receive. Payments can be made several ways:

Check: Online, by mail, or in person

Credit Card: Online, over the phone, or in person

Cash: In person only
