

Wilmington University College of Education Promise Grants

In elementary school classrooms, racially and ethnically diverse student populations benefit from diversity among their teachers. WilmU's Promise Grant program seeks to change the face of teaching by sponsoring cohorts of aspiring educators of color.

The program funds full-time studies toward the Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education (K-6), and provides one-onone guidance from experienced educators.

Promise Grant recipients receive:

- Tuition credits to cover up to 12 credits per semester for four semesters
- Funding to cover all textbook costs and/or other academic fees
- A mentor to coach them through their education journey
- Eligibility to apply for WilmU's Year-Long Residency Program, provided they qualify for student teaching

Promise Grant recipients are required to:

- · Attend weekly Promise Progress Seminars led by a mentor
- Maintain reflective/interactive journals to be reviewed weekly
- Remain in good academic standing by meeting **GPA** requirements




