From Fiscal Year 2007-2008 to Fiscal Year 2017-2018, Wilmington University's unduplicated headcount grew from 12,071 to 19,520, an increase of 60% over a 10-year period.

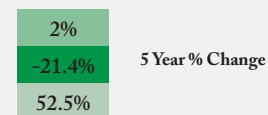
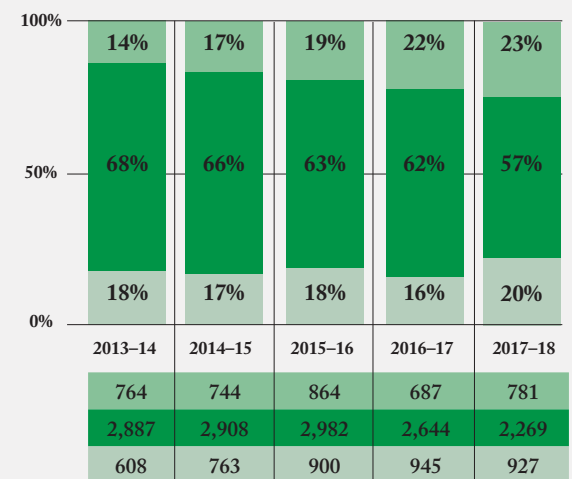
